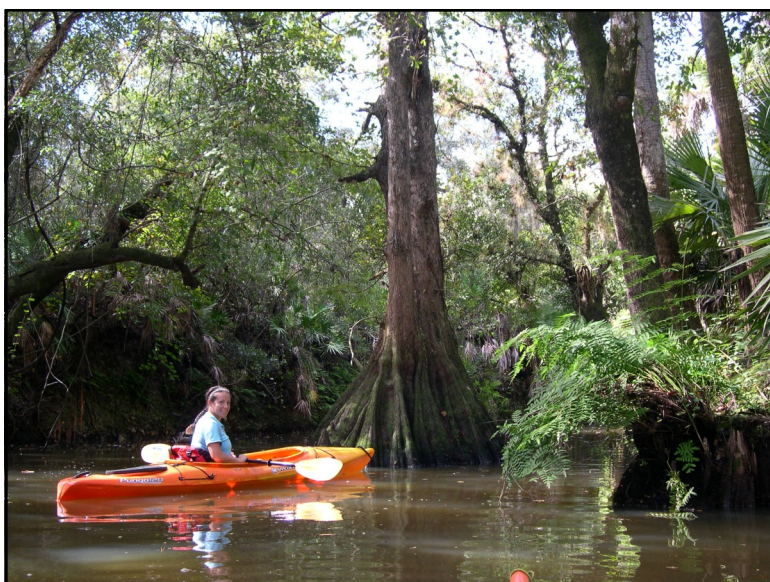
Caloosahatchee to Hickey's Creek Kayak Trip

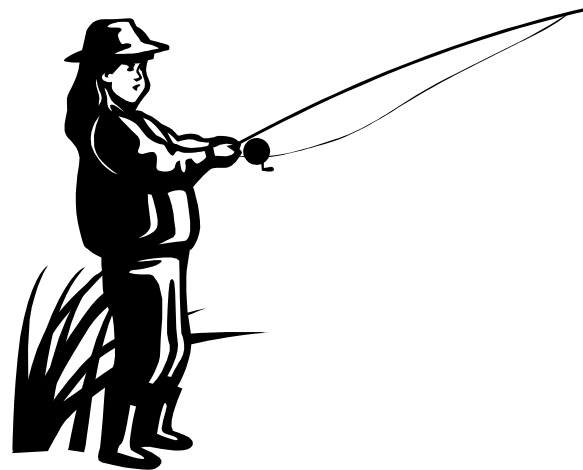
