

McGregor Boulevard Resurfacing Project from College Parkway to Keenan Avenue Starts January 17, 2012

The Florida Department of Transportation's contractor, Better Roads, Inc., starts a resurfacing project on McGregor Boulevard (State Road 867) from south of College Parkway to Keenan Avenue on Tuesday, January 17, 2012. Crews will begin work with installation of construction signs and silt fence used for erosion control during the job.

Variable message signs will be in place to alert drivers that work is underway. In the early part of the job, crews will be replacing areas of sidewalk. During the day from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., motorists should expect some sections of road within the work zone open only to a single lane of traffic. Flaggers will assist with management of traffic. The department recommends people plan extra travel time driving this segment of McGregor Boulevard.

The contractor estimates paving will be done at the end of February, and variable message signs will inform drivers before it begins. Paving operations will occur during nighttime/overnight hours from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. During paving and striping work, drivers should expect only one lane open to traffic. Flaggers will assist with management of traffic. With lane closures, slow moving traffic and delays are likely, and people should plan additional travel time on McGregor Boulevard.



Within 600 feet of the McGregor Boulevard/College Parkway intersection, lane closures are not permitted from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. for northbound traffic or from 5 a.m. to 10 p.m. for southbound traffic. No lane closures are permitted during peak travel hours from 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. to 7 p.m.

After the final layer of asphalt has been added at the end of February, a "cure period" lasts about 30 days. Work will resume at the end of March when crews will add permanent striping to the road. This work takes about five days. Project completion is estimated to be early April.

Cost of the project is \$590,000.

The department asks drivers, bicyclists, pedestrians, and runners using McGregor Boulevard and sidewalks along it to use caution during the project.

Please expect temporary changes to the roadway and sidewalk that could affect travel times and activities.
