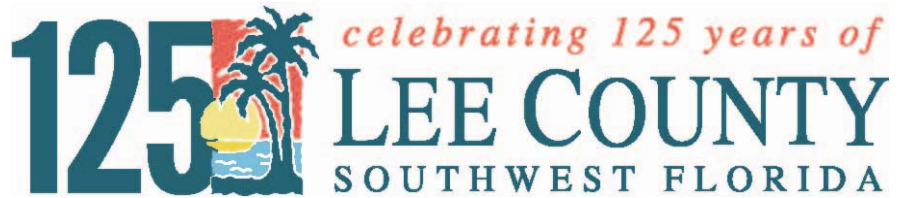

Fort Myers, Fla., Feb 1, 2012 – Lee County is celebrating its 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. Lee County was carved from Monroe County and incorporated on May 13, 1887. It was named for Robert E. Lee, Confederate general in the American Civil War. To commemorate this anniversary the County will host events throughout the year. To kick off the celebrations the Lee County Library System will present *Pioneers & Legends of Lee County's Past 125 Year ~ A Lecture Series*. The series is based on the resonant history and rich heritage of the people lucky enough to call Lee County home throughout the past 125 years. The lectures are free to the public, however registration is required. The lectures will also include personal mementos and photos of the people of the past. “When you hear the stories that have been handed down for generations it makes them much more interesting and real,” says Sheldon Kaye, Director of the Lee County Library System. “This County has a very exciting past with the fort, the Indians, the waterways and the early tourists. 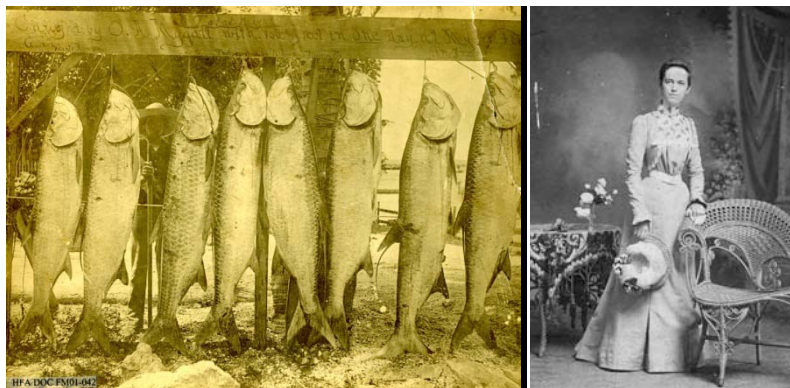
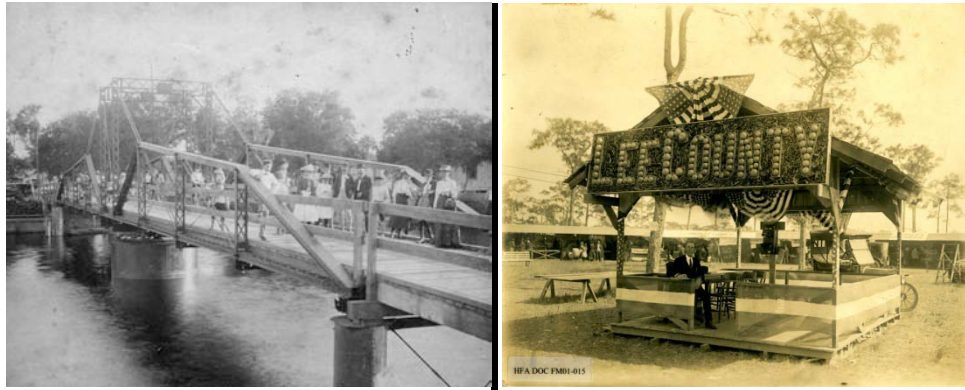
