Minutes of the Meeting of February 2, 2010

The committee; Chairman Anne Flaughner, Secretary Mary Richey, Dave Morrow, Dave Ceilley and Keith Gomez meet at 8 o'clock AM at the median between Westminster and Kenilworth with Ameratech's Dale Uhl.

Maintenance - We discussed maintenance of this median. Dale Uhl said that his crew would work on an hourly basis (\$25. Is the rate) to clean up the median. Ameratech will haul away all clippings and plants that will be removed. Members of the committee were welcome to participate in the clean up. We will be notified in advance of the day of cleanup. Either Dave Ceilley or Mary Richey, or both of them will participate. Mr. Uhl estimated that the cost of the cleanup should be within the estimate of between \$200 - \$300, and could be less.

This median will be included in Ameratech's regular maintenance.

Fertilizer - Mr. Uhl stated that they were already using slow-release fertilizer. They are presently spraying fertilizer 3 times a year, but would apply granular slow release in February, May, and October in accordance with Lee County's Regulations. The fertilizer formulation will be of our choosing. He buys it from Lesco.

Mulch - The committee decided to use pine bark mulch instead of the melaleuca. It should last longer, and can be applied right on top of the melaleuca ground cover. Pine bark mulch can be purchased through forestry Resources.

Message from Wendy Gault - Dave Morrow reported that Wendy Gault, president of the TRA, had been in touch with Pat Rohaley about the condition of the new plantings. Rohaley wants to wait until the first of March to see if any plants need replacing.

Meeting adjourned at 8:39.
